

Northwest Missouri State University is proud to partner with Northland Center for Advanced Professional Studies (CAPS) to offer several Dual Credit opportunities. Enclosed you will find information on the college courses that are offered in each of the Northland CAPS strands as well as the Admission Requirements to participate in Northwest Dual Credit.

ADMISSION *requirements*

11th or 12th grade students attending public and private accredited high schools: minimum of 3.0 Cumulative GPA OR minimum of 2.5 Cumulative GPA and an ACT score of 21 OR minimum of 2.5 Cumulative GPA and Combined Percentile Index of 100. Combined Percentile Index can be calculated at nwmissouri.edu/admissions/apply/freshmen/index-calculator.htm.

*Homeschool students must submit their test scores. Scores will be accepted for ACT, SAT, ASPIRE, Pre-ACT, or PSAT. ACT/SAT Superscores will also be accepted.

*all students must complete the Dual Credit application, complete with parent/guardian signatures, and school counselor recommendation.

INCO 77217 Profession-Based Essentials *(enroll in only one of the following courses)*

Credits: 1 Credit serves as elective credit at Northwest

A profession-based skills development course that prepares students for a profession-based work experience, internship, or practicum. Topics to be covered include National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) skills/qualities such as communication skills (verbal and written), teamwork, leadership, problem solving, and initiative. Students will have the opportunity to gain profession-based essential skills through exercises, case studies, and seminar discussion.

INCO 77297 Profession-Based Work Experience

Credits: 3 Credits serve as elective credit at Northwest

A profession-based work experience that enables students to work within a business context, clarify their career goals, and develop their professional skills under the supervision, guidance, and mentoring of an industry professional. Credit will vary depending upon time spent. One hour of credit requires 50 hours of work time. Prerequisite: approval of the instructor. May be repeated for up to a total of 6 hours.
